Co-design activity

- Co-design workshops and interviews over 5 years in 3 phases
 - Phase 1 97 PLHIV and 63 clinicians
 - Phase 2: 72 PLHIV and 32 clinicians
 - Phase 3: 5 workshops at each clinic including
 PLHIV and clinicians
- Workshops and interviews facilitated by community partners
- Annual community partner network meetings





Co-design for accountability

- Starting with a 'blank sheet of paper'
- How people use apps / health apps
- Suggestions for useful functionalities
- 'Treasure chest' of ideas
- Maintained as an app functionality checklist
- Providing a basis for accountability and feedback
- Fed into commercialisation discussion

- All costed into the EmERGE Health Ltd business model




